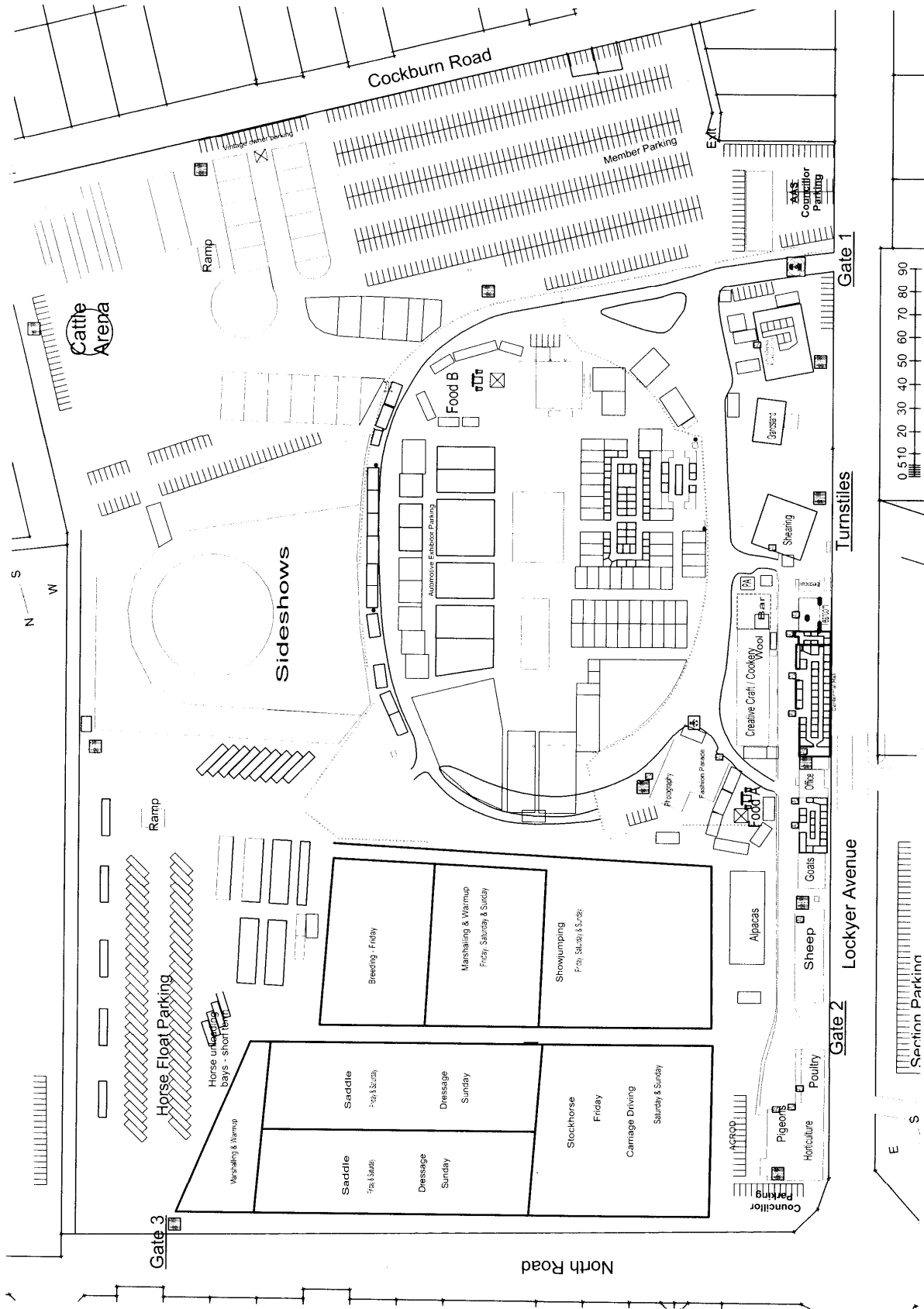

RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. The Society's Annual Show is held under the Society's Rules and Regulations, a copy of which may be seen at the Secretary's office. The committee may add, alter, vary or revoke any Rules and Regulations it may deem advisable.
2. The committee reserves the power to reject or remove any Exhibitor, servant or attendant, or any visitor from the Show without being required to give any explanation or being liable for compensation. The powers conferred on the committee shall be delegated to the Secretary and all monies won by such offenders shall be forfeited.
3. **NO DOGS**, except for exhibition, will be allowed on the grounds. 
4. The committee reserves the right to postpone, and further postpone any Show from the advertised date, and may make any alterations it deems desirable in the schedule of prizes, or other show arrangements.
5. The decision of the Society on all points shall be final and without recourse.
6. No exhibit shall be staged for competition until subscription or entrance fees are paid to the Society.
7. **NO GATE ENTRY FEE WILL BE REFUNDED.**
8. Quantities, weights and numbers will be strictly adhered to.
9. Membership fees: May be reviewed by July 2010. Family Up to two Adults and children under 16 YO) \$45; Adult \$20; Senior (Aged and Senior Card holder) \$15; Senior over 80 years of age FREE; Young Adult (16 & 17 YO) \$15; Junior (6 – 15 YO inclusive) \$10; Infant (0 - 5 YO inclusive) FREE, First Parking Pass \$4; Second Parking Pass \$10.
10. All persons competing and exhibiting in the Show do so at their own risk.
11. No protest will be considered if person protesting has not an entry in the class concerned.
12. The Head steward of each section reserves the right to reject and remove from the ground any exhibit, which is in their opinion dangerous or objectionable.
13. The Albany Agricultural Society Incorporated Committee will not be held liable for loss of or damage to the exhibitor's property whilst on the grounds.
14. Stewards reserve the right to re-enter an entry into a more appropriate section and/or class.
15. Please ensure all vehicles are removed immediately after they have been unloaded and parked opposite the Showground in Lockyer Ave. All vehicles parked illegally upon the grounds shall be **TOWED AWAY WITHOUT NOTICE.** 
16. **NO ALCOHOL** is to be brought onto the grounds.

NOTICES

All exhibitors must pay entrance fee to the grounds each day unless financial members of the Albany Agricultural Society Inc.

Exhibitors will please check individual sections for times that exhibits in the various sections must be in place. These times will be rigidly adhered to.

Exhibits MUST NOT be dismantled or removed from ground before 5:00pm Saturday.

In the event of there being no competition in any particular Class, prizes may be given if the judges certify to particular merit, however, they are specifically requested to with-hold prizes - even where there is competition if the exhibits are of inferior description, or not suitable for the class in which they are competing, they may be awarded a 2nd prize.

Prize money where applicable will be available at the Secretary's office from 1:00pm Saturday 13th November 2010. If you are GST registered, you must provide a tax invoice to the Albany Agricultural Society to claim prize money including GST. All prize money not collected by Friday 17th December 2010 (or tax invoices not lodged) will revert back to the Society.

Entries in Trade Display Sections and various Show Sections will be received by the Society's office at the Showground, **please check your relevant section for closing dates AS NO LATE ENTRIES ARE RECEIVED IN MOST SECTIONS.**

PLEASE NOTE:

The Committee reserves the right to restrict entries in any class should the need arise.

Please submit entries on original applications forms supplies with Schedules. For Alpacas section this is a **requirement.**

JUDGE: Mrs Angela Preuss

SECTION CONDITIONS:

1. Age of Alpaca – must be entered into the correct class at their age on the actual day of the Show, being 11th November 2011.
2. All alpacas must be registered with the Australian Alpaca Association Limited and carry an approved brass tag showing the alpacas IAR number. Wethers must also be registered but does not have to be registered in the name of the exhibitor. No wether may have any visible genetic fault.

NOTE: If there is no IAR tag present in the ear of an exhibit, official Association confirmation must be provided by the owner to the chief steward that the ear tag has been recently lost and that a new tag has been ordered and paid for. Failure to present such advice at inspection will result in disqualification of the animal.

3. **A copy of the pedigree certificate is no longer required.**
4. No male animal shall be eligible for exhibition if it is not entire (except wethers). All genitalia shall be complete, properly formed and proportioned for normal reproduction.
5. The Australian Alpaca Association Limited shall appoint a person or persons as an inspector or inspectors who shall inspect all alpacas for genetic faults, colour class and IAR number.
6. The Inspector or Chief Steward will classify all entries for colour and has the power to transfer an exhibit to the class which, in his / her opinion it should have been entered. The Chief Steward will combine or split classes as he/she sees fit.
7. Exhibits of Huacaya must carry a minimum fleece length of 50mm and a recommended maximum length not exceeding 130mm. The minimum fleece length for Suri is 75mm and fleece length will be assessed by the judge.
8. Any alpaca found to have lice infestation must be removed from the show grounds immediately along with any other Alpacas present that belong to the same exhibitor.
9. All feed and water containers are the responsibility of the exhibitor.
10. A veterinary surgeon will be available during the show period for any sick or injured animal. Exhibitors requiring this service are responsible for payment for all services rendered.
11. All alpacas are to be on the grounds by 5:30pm Thursday 10th November 2011 and are not to be removed before 5:00pm Saturday 12th November 2011.
12. The age of an animal is taken on the day of judging, Friday 11th November 2011.
13. Should any entry be rejected by the Society or withdrawn for any reason the entry fee is non-refundable.
14. Any decision or determination of disqualification is entirely within the discretion of the Chief Steward and shall not be challenged or called into question in any proceedings or any manner whatsoever.

Judging:

1. A competitor may not discuss with the Judge their alpacas or proposed exhibits prior to, or during the show judging.
2. The Judges decision shall be final. He / She may choose not to award a prize or prizes in a class.
3. All attendants leading stock in the judging ring or parade shall wear a white coat over long trousers or long skirt with clean dress shoes or boots.
4. The Chief Steward may disqualify an exhibitor for incorrect attire.
5. All exhibitors shall on the day of the show obtain their pen position and animal exhibit card numbers from the Shed Steward. The animal exhibit number card of the exhibit must be

worn and clearly displayed by the handler whilst in the show ring. The age of the alpaca, in months, will be displayed on the card.

6. All handlers showing animals must be competent in the handling of their exhibit or removal from the ring may be requested by the Judge. It is recommended that small children not exhibit large animals that they cannot control.
7. All exhibitors must place their animals in the pens allotted by the Show Stewards and must not be moved or removed except by order of the Chief Steward.

Order of Judging:

The Show Convenor has the option of placing judging of Suri classes, Champions and Supreme first in the Catalogue, with the proviso that this is stated clearly in the Show Schedule. Fancy and Wether classes are to be held at the beginning of the Show or between Suri's and Huacaya's. The intent is not to have them at the time of judging Supremes.

Correct Animal Colour Class:

1. An alpaca is to be shown in the appropriate colour class, when it is predominantly that colour. Any colour variations will be assessed at the time of inspection.
2. Exhibits shall not have fleece of a different colour to that of the blanket removed from an animal to a level below that of the blanket fleece.
3. **A fancy alpaca** is to be shown in a fancy class if it has an unusual or striking distribution of colour, eg. Different coloured saddle markings. A non-solid coloured animal with different colour markings on the head, chest or legs does not constitute a fancy alpaca.
4. **A predominantly grey alpaca** (light, medium, dark grey, rose grey) is to be shown in a grey class, whether or not it has any other coloured spots present and any colour variations will be assessed at the Judge's discretion.
5. **A roan alpaca** is a fawn, brown or black with a significant amount of white fibres throughout the fleece and should be shown in a Roan class.
