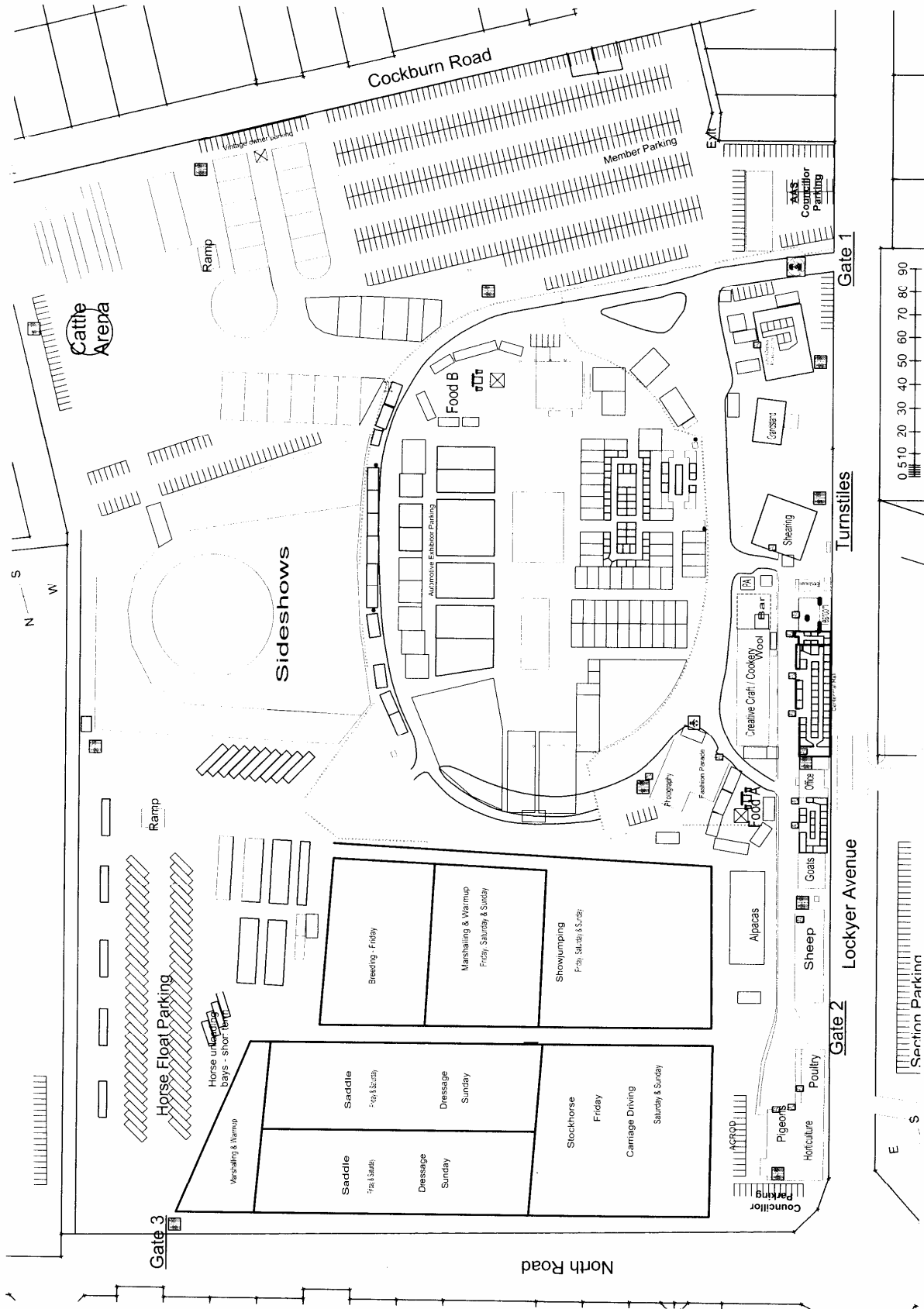

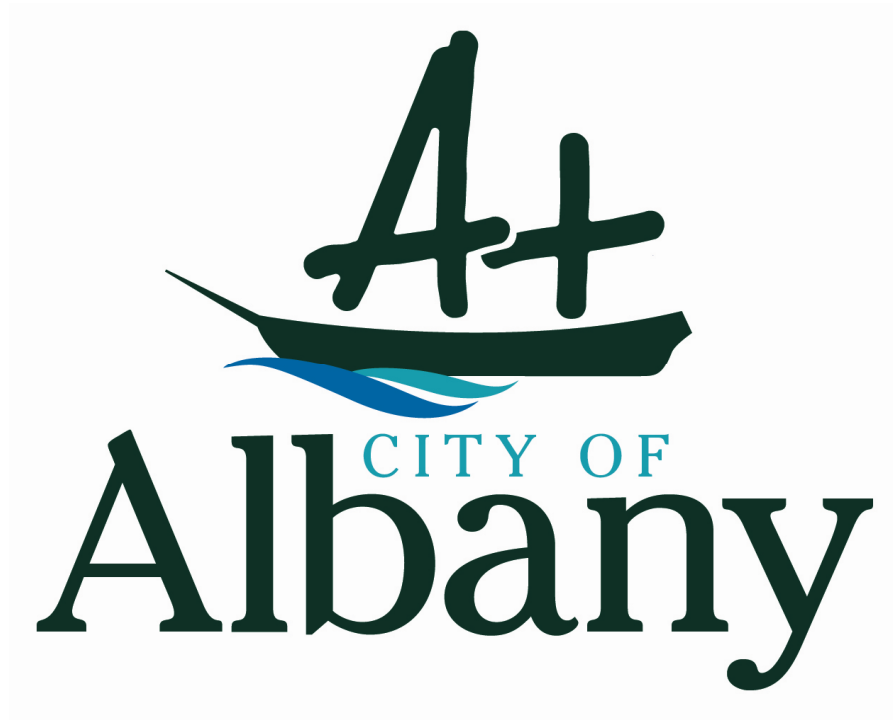

1. The Society's Annual Show is held under the Society's Rules and Regulations, a copy of which may be seen at the Secretary's office. The committee may add, alter, vary or revoke any Rules and Regulations it may deem advisable.
2. The committee reserves the power to reject or remove any Exhibitor, servant or attendant, or any visitor from the Show without being required to give any explanation or being liable for compensation. The powers conferred on the committee shall be delegated to the Secretary and all monies won by such offenders shall be forfeited.
3. **NO DOGS**, except for exhibition, will be allowed on the grounds. 
4. The committee reserves the right to postpone, and further postpone any Show from the advertised date, and may make any alterations it deems desirable in the schedule of prizes, or other show arrangements.
5. The decision of the Society on all points shall be final and without recourse.
6. No exhibit shall be staged for competition until subscription or entrance fees are paid to the Society.
7. **NO GATE ENTRY FEE WILL BE REFUNDED.**
8. Quantities, weights and numbers will be strictly adhered to.
9. Membership fees: May be reviewed by July 2010. Family Up to two Adults and children under 16 YO) \$45; Adult \$20; Senior (Aged and Senior Card holder) \$15; Senior over 80 years of age FREE; Young Adult (16 & 17 YO) \$15; Junior (6 – 15 YO inclusive) \$10; Infant (0 - 5 YO inclusive) FREE, First Parking Pass \$4; Second Parking Pass \$10.
10. All persons competing and exhibiting in the Show do so at their own risk.
11. No protest will be considered if person protesting has not an entry in the class concerned.
12. The Head steward of each section reserves the right to reject and remove from the ground any exhibit, which is in their opinion dangerous or objectionable.
13. The Albany Agricultural Society Incorporated Committee will not be held liable for loss of or damage to the exhibitor's property whilst on the grounds.
14. Stewards reserve the right to re-enter an entry into a more appropriate section and/or class.
15. Please ensure all vehicles are removed immediately after they have been unloaded and parked opposite the Showground in Lockyer Ave. All vehicles parked illegally upon the grounds shall be **TOWED AWAY WITHOUT NOTICE.** 
16. **NO ALCOHOL** is to be brought onto the grounds.

All exhibitors must pay entrance fee to the grounds each day unless financial members of the Albany Agricultural Society Inc.

Exhibitors will please check individual sections for times that exhibits in the various sections must be in place. These times will be rigidly adhered to.

Exhibits MUST NOT be dismantled or removed before 5pm Saturday.

In the event of there being no competition in any particular Class, prizes may be given if the judges certify to particular merit, however, they are specifically requested to with-hold prizes - even where there is competition if the exhibits are of inferior description, or not suitable for the class in which they are competing, they may be awarded a 2nd prize.

Prize money will be available at the Secretary's office from 1:00pm Saturday 13th November 2010. If you are GST registered, you must provide a tax invoice to the Albany Agricultural Society to claim prize money including GST. All prize money not collected by Friday 17th December 2010 (or tax invoices not lodged) will revert back to the Society.

The Muriel Haines Perpetual Trophy goes to the Best Exhibit "Cake Decorating" Sub-Section 103.

The Glenice Flett Perpetual Trophy goes to the Exhibitor gaining Most Points over the Creative Craft and Cookery Section. **Must have been awarded points in a minimum of three sub-sections.**

All Most Points Trophy awards based on 3 points for 1st, 2 points for 2nd and 1 point for 3rd.

RULES

1. All work exhibited in these sections must be the work of the individual exhibitor and must have been **finished** between November 2009 and November 2010 although it may have been in progress any length of time and must not have been exhibited at any previous Albany Agricultural Show. All ages mentioned in Schedule refer to age as at 1st July 2010.
2. **NO GROUP ENTRIES ARE ACCEPTED EXCEPT IN "ONE FAMILY'S WORK" and "THE SCHOOL CLASS PROJECT" or in classes permitting Commercial Quilting. ie. a second person who must be acknowledged.**
3. Prizes will be awarded at the Judges discretion. First prize is not necessarily awarded.
4. In case of tied points in any section, the Most Points prize will be awarded to the person with the most 1st prizes followed by 2nd and 3rd prizes if necessary.
5. Entries must be lodged for all sections at the Secretary's Office located at the show grounds by **4:00pm Tuesday 9th November 2010**. All entry fees are GST inclusive.

NO LATE ENTRIES ACCEPTED.

6. Please check **other sections** before entering under "any other article".
7. Entries must be benched between 7:30am and 9:30am Thursday 11th November 2010 in all sections except "The School Class Project" which may be also be benched between 4:00pm and 5:00pm on Wednesday 10th November 2010.
8. Judging commences in all classes at 10.00am Thursday 11th November 2010.
9. **Judges decisions are final. Any formal complaint must be in writing addressed to the Councillor in Charge at the Society's office.**
10. Doors will be open to the public at 9.00am Friday 12th November 2010.
11. No entry is to be removed before 5.00pm Saturday 13th November 2010. **Access to displays will be restricted between 4:30pm and 5:00pm to allow Stewards to dismantle them ready for collection between 5:00pm and 6:00pm. Exhibits will only be released on presentation of entry receipt or written permission of entrant.**
12. Any entries not collected at this time will be held in the Secretary's office for collection up to Friday 17th December 2010.
13. Trophies will be presented in the Bob Sandilands Pavilion on Saturday 13th November 2010 between 4:00pm and 4:30pm.
14. A maximum of three (3) entries per exhibitor per class unless otherwise stated.
15. Any exhibit may be entered in **only one class**.
16. **No person other than Stewards and Judges will be allowed in Pavilion after benching is completed at 9:30am Thursday 11th November 2010. ie during judging.**

- Novelty Cake:** Must be a Cake (ie butter cake, mud cake, fruit cake) may be used, supported by icing techniques. The type of cake used must be stated on entry ticket by entrant prior to benching.
- A Cake** must be used in Novice and Junior sections.
- Cake Forms** may be used in Open section unless otherwise stated.

RULES AND HINTS

ALL ENTRIES EXCEPT CLASSES 15 AND 16 (Pastry) TO BE EXHIBITED ON WHITE DISPOSABLE PLATES OF SUITABLE SHAPE ie USE OVAL PLATES FOR LOAF ENTRIES, NO DOILIES. ALL CAKES ARE TO BE BAKED IN 20cm ROUND TINS UNLESS OTHERWISE STATED. Freshness, fineness and evenness of both texture and colour, plus attractive display are all important. When cakes are taken out of the oven for Show Exhibiting they should be cooled on a clean towel - marks from a wire cake cooler will loose points. Scones should be baked separately, not parted after cooking with no excess flour. Small Cakes are judged on daintiness. Lamingtons should be uniform in size. Sponge Sandwich should both be from same baking. In class 7, Fruit Cake must be made using the 250gm recipe listed below class.

250 gm of each of following: Butter, Raisins, Brown Sugar, Dates, Currants, Sultanas and Plain Flour, 5 Eggs, 30gm each Orange and Lemon Peel. 60gm of each of the following: Self Raising Flour, Almonds and Red Cherries. 1/2 teaspoon each of Almond, Lemon and Vanilla Essences and Ground Ginger, Cinnamon and Crushed Cloves, 1/4 Grated Nutmeg, 1/4 wine glass Brandy. **MUST BE BAKED IN A 20cm ROUND TIN ONLY.** Cut fruit to uniform size.

8. Fruit Cake – Pumpkin baked in a round tin
9. Fruit Cake - Boiled baked in a round tin
10. Lamingtons - 6 only - up to 6 x 6cm
11. Madeira (Butter) cake - NOT iced, may include fruit or nuts
12. Muffins - 6 only - any flavour
13. Orange Cake - NOT iced, baked in loaf tin
14. Pastry - Open Flan - fruit, lemon meringue et cetera
15. Pastry - Pie Covered - pastry top and bottom
16. Pastry - any other item - mince pies, tartlets, sausage rolls et cetera

PLEASE NOTE CHANGES TO “LIDS ON CONTAINERS” DUE TO HEALTH REGULATIONS ie CORRECT RECOVERING AFTER JUDGING.

Notes:

All entries to have been made since the 2009 Show

Avoid using lids from pickle jars and other strong flavoured preserves on jams.

Screw top or twist top lids only must be used on Pickle and Preserves jars. “Vacola” jars may be used for classes 19, 26 and 27. Screw top, twist top lids and wire spring tops may be used on sauce bottles.

Minimum size of all jars for Pickles and Jams et cetera to be 350 grams

All jars and bottles must be clean and free from mould.

Jars should be well filled to neck at least.

Consistency, flavour and colour gain points.

In class 17, cut fruit finely. Marmalade should be clear with fruit evenly distributed throughout the jar.

Labels should be neat and clear, no larger than 50mm x 25mm leaving enough space to add entry ticket on bottle or jar. **Please label each item as part of a group in classes 9, 18 & 25.**

Only clear glass bottles or jars are to be used.

Brand names on containers and lids must be removed or covered.

No cloth or paper covers may be used on jars.

Entry tickets must be attached to each jar or bottle, NOT to top or lids.

Bottle fruit MUST be perfect fruit with no blemishes and correctly lined up

ALL ITEMS IN THIS SECTION TO BE QUILTED BUT NOT NECESSARILY PIECED. ie PATCHWORK OR APPLIQUED

Quilting is defined as 3 separate textile / fibre layers having been stitched together either by hand or machine.

Items must be finished since 2008 Show but may have been in progress any length of time.

Commercial quilting only allowed in classes 3 and 14 – quilter must be named and acknowledged by exhibitor on entry ticket

FULL SIZE BED QUILTS – Minimum size 120cm x 150cm (48” x 60”)

CLASS:

1. Hand pieced Patchwork Quilt - hand or machine Quilting
2. Machine pieced Patchwork Quilt - hand or machine Quilting
3. Hand or machine pieced Patchwork Quilt commercially quilted - quilter to named and acknowledged
4. Quilt featuring appliqué - Hand or machine worked and quilted

COT QUILTS – MAXIMUM SIZE 120 X 150cm (48” X 60”) no commercial quilting

5. Hand or machine pieced Cot Quilt - with hand or machine quilting
6. Hand or machine appliquéed Cot Quilt - with hand or machine quilting

WALL HANGINGS – MAXIMUM SIZE 150 X 170cm (60” X 68”) must have hanging attachments, no commercial quilting

7. Hand or machine pieced and quilted wall hanging
8. Hand or machine appliquéd and quilted wall hanging
9. Contemporary / Art wall hanging - hand or machine worked, may include hand or machine over stitching, collage, beads et cetera

MINIATURE QUILTS

10. Miniature Quilt - any format hand / machine / appliqué - maximum size 35 x 45cm (14" x 18")

ANY OTHER QUILTED ARTICLE – not quilts or wall hangings

11. Any Quilted article - over 30 x 30cm (12" x 12") - eg cushion, table mat, bag et cetera
12. Any Quilted article under 30 x 30cm (12" x 12") - eg small bag, broach, needle case et
13. Any Quilted garment - eg coat, waistcoat, skirt et cetera

NEW QUILTERS – under 2 years experience on 1st July 2010

14. Full size bed Quilt – minimum size 120cm x 150cm (48” x 60”) by quilter with under 2 years experience - any construction, may be commercially quilted - quilter to be named and acknowledged
15. Wall Hanging by quilter with under 2 years experience - with hanging attachment - any construction maximum size 150 x 170cm (60" x 68")
16. Any other Quilted article by quilter with under 2 years experience - eg garment, cushion, bag et cetera

5. Any other article decorated with beads - eg purse, lampshade, shoes et cetera
6. Child's soft toy - knitted or fabric – animal, doll et cetera
