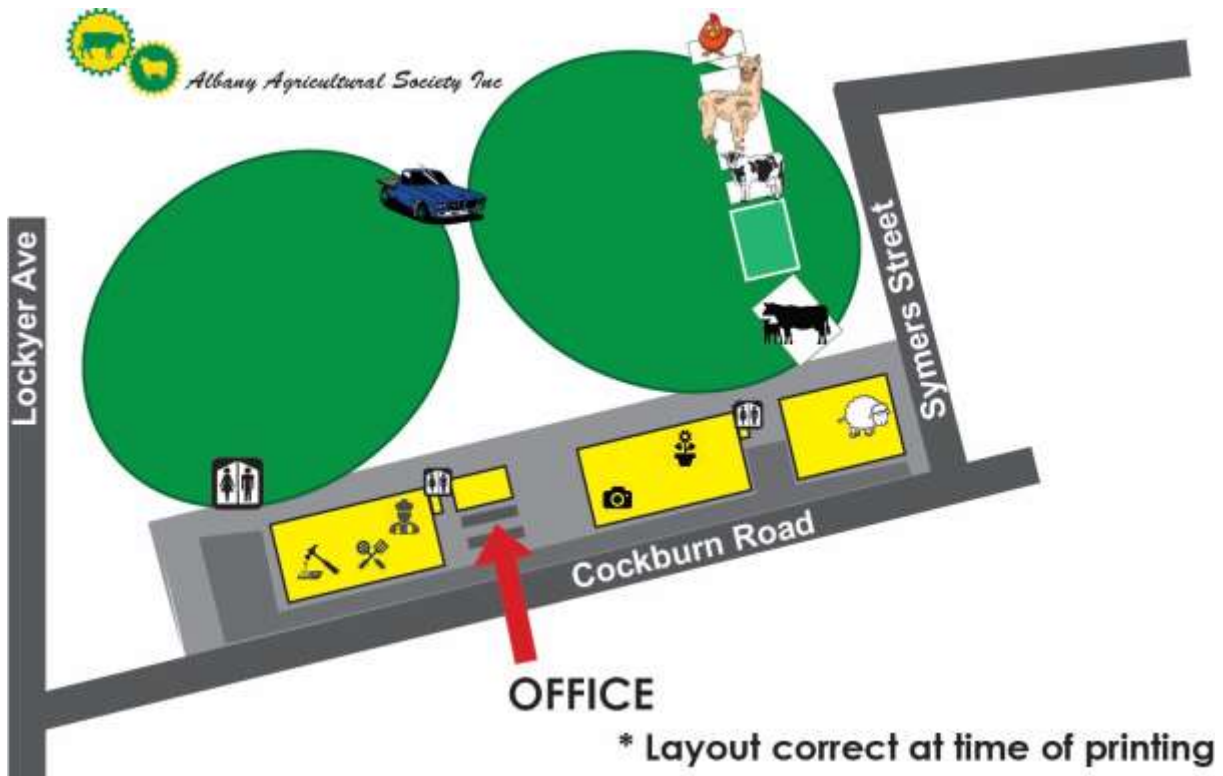
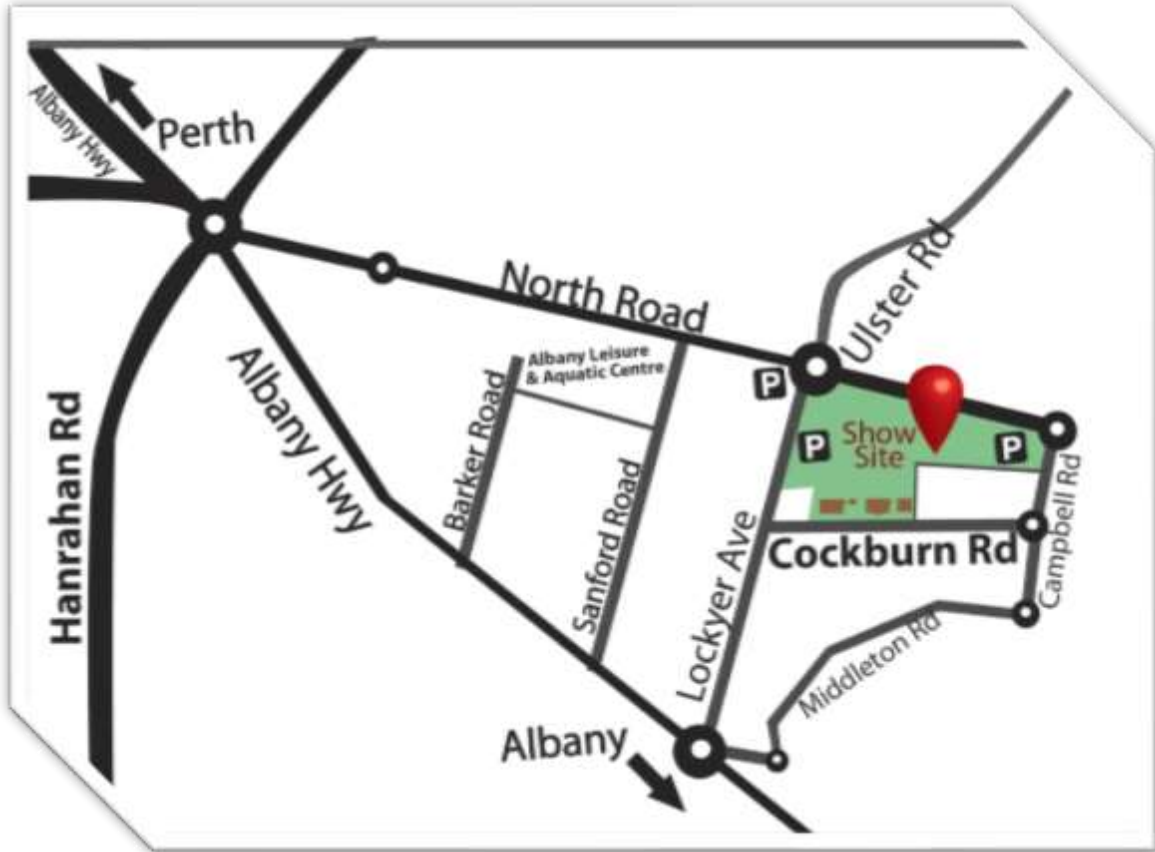

2. No exhibit shall be staged for competition until subscription or entrance fees are paid to the Society. Fees may be paid by direct credit, cheque, EFTPOS or cash. Entry Forms may be received via email, or mail. If Entry Cards are to be returned please allow time for them to be processed.
3. The committee reserves the power to reject or remove any Exhibitor, servant or attendant, or any visitor from the Show without being required to give any explanation or being liable for compensation. The powers conferred on the committee shall be delegated to the Secretary and all monies won by such offenders shall be forfeited.
4. **NO DOGS**, excepting registered Assistance Dogs or Dogs for exhibition/competition, will be allowed on the grounds. 
5. The committee reserves the right to postpone, and further postpone any Show from the advertised date, and may make any alterations it deems desirable in the schedule of prizes, or other show arrangements.
6. The decision of the Society on all points shall be final and without recourse.
7. **NO GATE ENTRY FEE AND/OR MEMBERSHIP FEES WILL BE REFUNDED.**
8. Quantities, weights and numbers will be strictly adhered to.
9. All persons competing and exhibiting in the Show do so at their own risk.
10. No protest will be considered if person protesting has not an entry in the class concerned.
11. The Head Steward of each section reserves the right to reject and remove from the ground any exhibit, which is in their opinion dangerous or objectionable.
12. The Albany Agricultural Society Incorporated Committee will not be held liable for loss of or damage to the exhibitor's property whilst on the grounds.
13. Stewards reserve the right to re-enter an entry into a more appropriate section and/or class.

RULES FOR EXHIBITING

1. **DISEASED** or insect infested exhibits will be immediately disqualified and must be removed from the Pavilion.
2. **EXHIBITS** must have been grown by the exhibitor and in the case of Pot Plants have been owned by the exhibitor for at least 8 weeks prior to the show.
3. **DRESSING** and staging of all exhibits must be done in the Staging Area, only minor adjustments are to be made on the benches. Once benched, the exhibits are under the jurisdiction of the Stewards and must not be touched without their permission. Should it become necessary for the Stewards to move the exhibits, every endeavor will be made not to disturb the presentation.
4. **SPECIMENS** must be displayed in the tubes and bottles provided.
5. **SPECIMEN FLOWERS** must have their own stems and foliage, with no artificial Supports. It is recommended that they face the judge.
6. **COLLARS** are only provided for Pansies and Violas. They are not allowed for other flowers.
7. **ROSE** buds must show colour. They become a bloom when the guard or outer petals drop to more than 45 degrees and are a full bloom when the centre is visible. A BUD on a specimen as well as the primary bud or bloom disqualifies the entry as a single specimen, it then becomes a 'cut'.
8. **BOWL** is a round container without adornment such as handles, of which the total diameter is greater than the height and the diameter of the mouth is not less than $\frac{2}{3}$ of the total diameter. The arrangement should form a 'ball shape' to compliment the size of the bowl.
9. **VASE** is a round container without adornment such as handles, of which the height is greater than the total diameter. The arrangement should form a 'pyramid shape' that is $1\frac{1}{2}$ times the height of the vase.
10. **CONTAINER** is all other shaped vessels and those with handles, spouts and other additions. It can be anything (eg a Trough or Shallow Bowl etc) that will hold soil in which to grow plants or display flowers.
11. **N.N.D.** (NOT NECESSARILY DISTINCT) means that while of the same species (ie. Roses) it is not necessary for them to be different varieties (ie. Peace or Mr. Lincoln). They can be either 3 of all the same variety, 2 the same plus 1 different or can be 3 different varieties.
12. **N.P.M.** (NOT PREVIOUSLY MENTIONED) means that either the species or the type (eg. variegated foliage) has not been included in any other class in that section but that the entry can be included in the general heading of the section (eg. Specimens or Pot Plant etc).
13. **POINTS** for determining the MOST POINTS in a section shall be awarded as **3 points** for First place and **1 point** for Second place in each class.
14. **BONSAI** will be judged on their overall health and suitability for growing in this form. They must be mature in appearance and not be dominated by the container. Any style is acceptable but an attempt to develop one of the known styles will gain more points. Ie; formal, Informal, Literati, Broom, Octopus, Windswept, Cascade etc.
15. **THE Horticulture Area of the Exhibition Pavilion** will be open to receive exhibits from Thursday 7:30am to 2:00pm and Friday and Saturday prior 9:00am.
16. Pots and containers need to be clean.

Absolutely no late entries.

NOTES ON PRESENTATION:

Size of container is unlimited. Hanging containers may be made of wire, porcelain, wood, plastic or any other material that can hold a growing plant and be hung up.

Plant should be of spreading, not upright nature suitable for hanging container

NOTES ON PRESENTATION:

Plates or foam trays will be provided for displaying all root vegetables, onions, peas, beans and fruit. Cauliflowers are to have curds exposed by cutting leaves to a neat fringe.

Root vegetables, other than potatoes, to have secondary roots removed and tops cut off neatly.
