## RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. The Society's Annual Show is held under the Society's Rules and Regulations, a copy of which may be seen at the Secretary's office. The committee may add, alter, vary or revoke any Rules and Regulations it may deem advisable.
2. The committee reserves the power to reject or remove any Exhibitor, servant or attendant, or any visitor from the Show without being required to give any explanation or being liable for compensation. The powers conferred on the committee shall be delegated to the Secretary and all monies won by such offenders shall be forfeited.
3. **NO DOGS**, except for exhibition, will be allowed on the grounds. 
4. The committee reserves the right to postpone, and further postpone any Show from the advertised date, and may make any alterations it deems desirable in the schedule of prizes, or other show arrangements.
5. The decision of the Society on all points shall be final and without recourse.
6. No exhibit shall be staged for competition until subscription or entrance fees are paid to the Society.
7. **NO GATE ENTRY FEE WILL BE REFUNDED.**
8. Quantities, weights and numbers will be strictly adhered to.
9. Membership fees: May be reviewed by July 2010. Family Up to two Adults and children under 16 YO) \$45; Adult \$20; Senior (Aged and Senior Card holder) \$15; Senior over 80 years of age FREE; Young Adult (16 & 17 YO) \$15; Junior (6 – 15 YO inclusive) \$10; Infant (0 - 5 YO inclusive) FREE, First Parking Pass \$4; Second Parking Pass \$10.
10. All persons competing and exhibiting in the Show do so at their own risk.
11. No protest will be considered if person protesting has not an entry in the class concerned.
12. The Head steward of each section reserves the right to reject and remove from the ground any exhibit, which is in their opinion dangerous or objectionable.
13. The Albany Agricultural Society Incorporated Committee will not be held liable for loss of or damage to the exhibitor's property whilst on the grounds.
14. Stewards reserve the right to re-enter an entry into a more appropriate section and/or class.
15. Please ensure all vehicles are removed immediately after they have been unloaded and parked opposite the Showground in Lockyer Ave. All vehicles parked illegally upon the grounds shall be **TOWED AWAY WITHOUT NOTICE.** 
16. **NO ALCOHOL** is to be brought onto the grounds.

Exhibitors will please check individual sections for times that exhibits in the various sections must be in place. These times will be rigidly adhered to.

**Exhibits MUST NOT be dismantled or removed from ground before 5:00pm Saturday.**

In the event of there being no competition in any particular Class, prizes may be given if the judges certify to particular merit, however, they are specifically requested to with-hold prizes - even where there is competition if the exhibits are of inferior description, or not suitable for the class in which they are competing, they may be awarded a 2<sup>nd</sup> prize.

**Prize money** where applicable will be available at the Secretary's office from 1:00pm Saturday 13<sup>th</sup> November 2010. If you are GST registered, you must provide a tax invoice to the Albany Agricultural Society to claim prize money including GST. All prize money not collected by Friday 17<sup>th</sup> December 2010 (or tax invoices not lodged) will revert back to the Society.

Entries in Trade Display Sections and various Show Sections will be received by the Society's office at the Showground, **please check your relevant section for closing dates AS NO LATE ENTRIES ARE RECEIVED IN MOST SECTIONS.**

The Committee reserves the right to restrict entries in any class should the need arise.

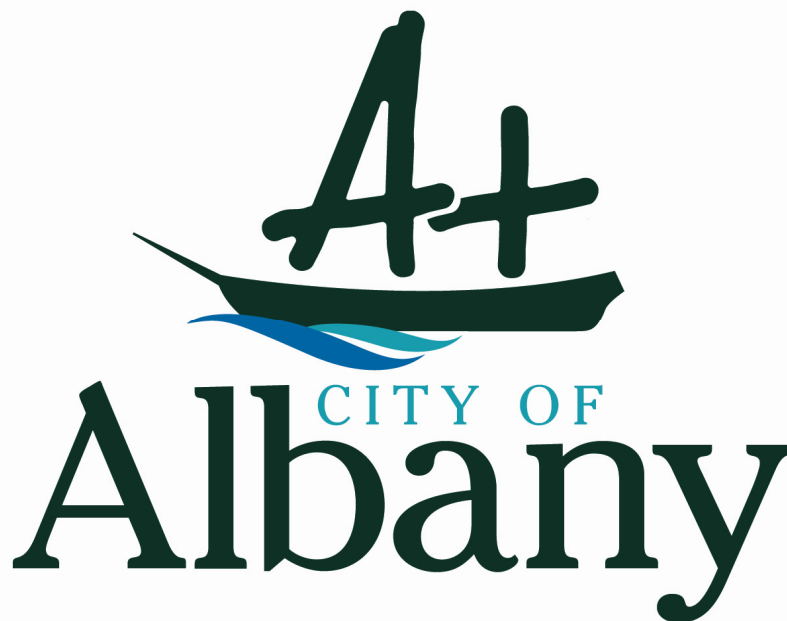

Trophies will be presented in Bob Sandilands Pavilion immediately following the Creative Craft presentation on Saturday 13<sup>th</sup> November 2010 at approximately 4:30pm.

**All entries are to be lodged at the Secretary's office, and close at 4:00pm Friday 29<sup>th</sup> October 2010 to enable bottle labels to be sent to exhibitors.**

**Entries to be delivered to Bob Sandilands Pavilion on the Showground between 4:00pm and 5:00pm on Wednesday 10<sup>th</sup> November 2010.**

***NO LATE ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED.***

***Conditions of entry:***

1. All exhibitors shall be deemed to have read and accepted the current "Conditions of Entry" and shall be bound by these conditions.
2. After the receipt of entries, and until the awards have been made, no person shall be permitted access to the exhibits, excepting Judges and Stewards.
3. Only one bottle (700 or 750ml) per entry. Exhibitors may show more than one entry per class providing that no two entries have the same main ingredient. NO corks / capsules on bottles, screw tops preferred.
4. Exhibitors please note that "Most Successful Exhibitor" is calculated from the average score of an exhibitor's points with a minimum of six (6) entries to qualify.
5. On receipt of entry forms, exhibitors will be sent their 'identification code' and stick-on label. These must be completed and attached with the bottom of the label 100mm from the bottom of the bottle. This is to maintain uniformity and to allow label information to be read after any award cards have been displayed.

6. Wine entries will be judged on the following scale of points

<b>Clarity (condition)</b>	<b>3 points</b>
<b>Bouquet</b>	<b>7 point</b>
<b>Palate (Flavour)</b>	<b>10 points</b>

Awards will be made as follows:

<b>18.5 points and over</b>	<b>Gold</b>
<b>17.0 to 18.4 points</b>	<b>Silver</b>
<b>15.5 to 16.9 points</b>	<b>Bronze</b>

7. The Judges and / or Chief Steward may disqualify an entry if it is considered to be falsely represented, and / or may transfer an entry to another class if considered to be wrongly entered.

8. Exhibitors shall be bound by the decision of the Judges and / or Chief Steward and no disputes will be entered into.
