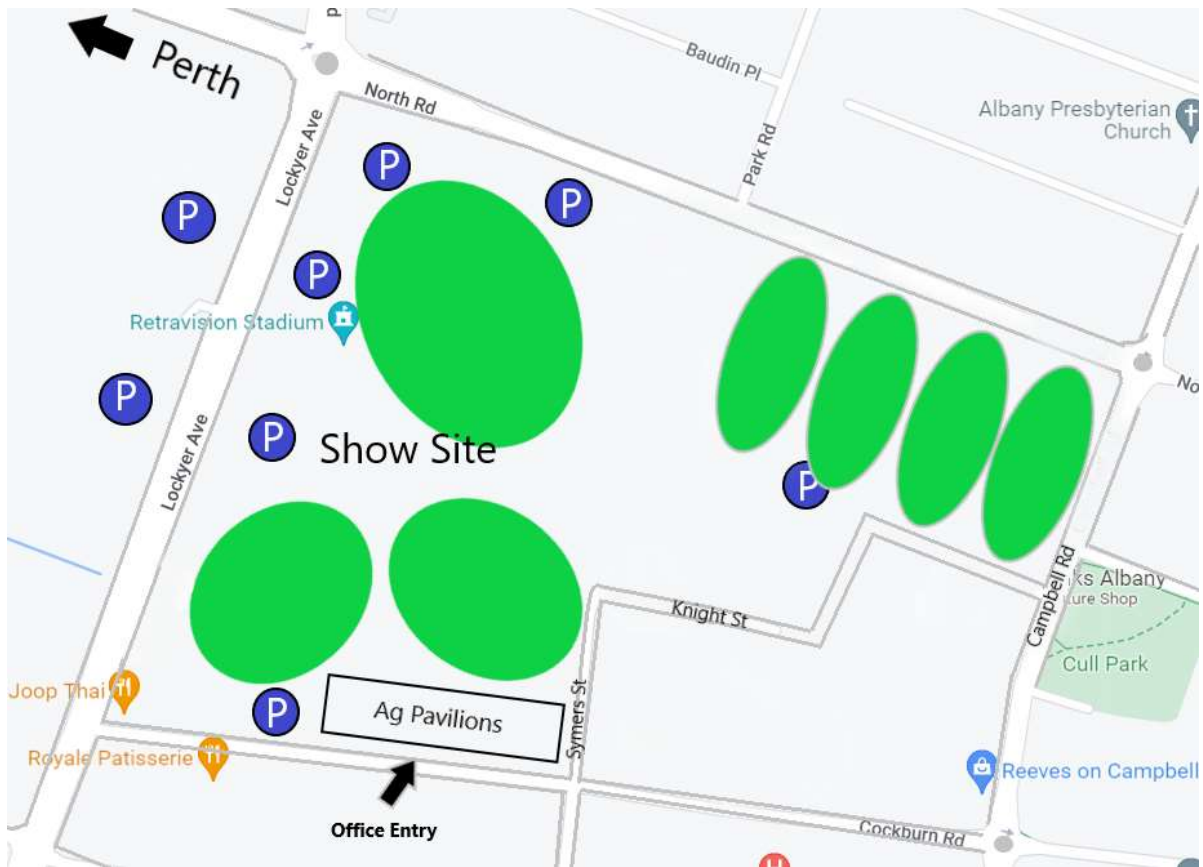

RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. The Society's Annual Show is held under the Society's Rules and Regulations. The committee may add, alter, vary or revoke any Rules and Regulations it may deem advisable.
2. No exhibit shall be staged for competition until subscription or entrance fees are paid to the Society. Fees may be paid by direct credit, cheque, EFTPOS or cash. Entry Forms may be received via email, or mail. If Entry Cards are to be returned, please allow time for them to be processed.
3. The committee reserves the power to reject or remove any Exhibitor, servant or attendant, or any visitor from the Show without being required to give any explanation or being liable for compensation. The powers conferred on the committee shall be delegated to the Secretary and all monies won by such offenders shall be forfeited.
4. **NO DOGS**, excepting registered Assistance Dogs or Dogs for exhibition/competition, will be allowed on the grounds. 
5. The committee reserves the right to postpone, and further postpone any Show from the advertised date, and may make any alterations it deems desirable in the schedule of prizes, or other show arrangements.
6. The decision of the Society on all points shall be final and without recourse.
7. **NO GATE ENTRY FEE AND/OR MEMBERSHIP FEES WILL BE REFUNDED.**
8. Quantities, weights and numbers will be strictly adhered to.
9. All persons competing and exhibiting in the Show do so at their own risk.
10. No protest will be considered if person protesting has not an entry in the class concerned.
11. The Head Steward of each section reserves the right to reject and remove from the ground any exhibit, which is in their opinion dangerous or objectionable.
12. The Albany Agricultural Society Incorporated Committee will not be held liable for loss of or damage to the exhibitor's property whilst on the grounds.
13. Stewards reserve the right to re-enter an entry into a more appropriate section and/or class.
14. Please ensure all vehicles are removed immediately after they have been unloaded and parked offsite in public parking zones. All vehicles parked illegally upon the grounds shall be **TOWED AWAY WITHOUT NOTICE.**
15. **NO ALCOHOL** is to be brought onto the grounds.

All exhibitors must pay an entrance fee to the grounds on Show Days.

Exhibitors will please check individual sections for times that exhibits in the various sections must be in place. These times will be rigidly adhered to.

Exhibits MUST NOT be dismantled or removed from the ground before 5:00pm on Saturday.

In the event of there being no competition in any particular Class, prizes may be given if the judges certify to particular merit, however, they are specifically requested to with-hold prizes - even where there is competition if the exhibits are of inferior description, or not suitable for the class in which they are competing, they may be awarded a 2nd prize.

Prize money where applicable will be deposited into the exhibitors nominated bank account.

Entries must be accompanied by a certificate to confirm entry is tested and certified CAE free.

General Information and Participation Requirements

1. Goats must be registered with DGSA, or registration applied for.
2. Exhibitors must be financial members of DGSA.
3. Breeders are requested to supply bedding and Stud signs for their stalls.
4. The Albany Agricultural Society has a Bio-Security Plan in place.
 - Any goat suffering from any kind of internal and external parasite and including lice eggs (dead or alive) will not be allowed to remain on the Showground.
 - Any goat showing signs of disease will be inspected and, if necessary, it's owner will be required to remove it from the grounds.
 - All exhibits arriving at the show grounds must be identified with a NLIS device and be accompanied by a waybill which is to be handed to the Councillor or Steward in charge upon arrival. The Albany Agricultural Show PIC is: WASG0024
5. Please submit production figures along with your entries for classes 23, 24, 25, 26. Production figures must be endorsed by the State Milk Awards officer (Trevor Blight Mob: 0418931499 Email: trevorblight204@hotmail.com)
6. Exhibitors are expected to present for judging animals that are safe to handle. Goats must walk freely on the lead and the use of physical aids such as whips will not be tolerated.
7. Goats prone to jumping must be tethered in their stalls.
8. All goats, when outside of pens, are expected to be on leads and under the control of a responsible handler.
9. Exhibitors and those supervising young/novice handlers are asked to ensure safe footwear and practices at all times.

Arrivals and Departures

Goats can arrive on the grounds for penning between 3 - 5 pm Thurs the 9th November or between 6.30 – 7.30 am Friday the 10th and 6.30 – 7.30 am Saturday 11th November.

Access is via Symers Street off Cockburn Road. Note: For Friday and Saturday mornings this is a cash-less entry point. Membership Cards or Pre-purchased entry tickets are required.

As soon as goats are unloaded and penned, please remove vehicles and trailers from the showgrounds to the designated goat parking area (must be pre-arranged) or remove your vehicles to members or general parking. Waybills must be handed to the Councillor in Charge of the Dairy Goat Section, Caralyn Lagrange. The Albany Agricultural Show PIC is: WASG0024

All exhibits are to remain on the show grounds until 5pm Saturday 11th, unless otherwise arranged with the councillor in charge.
